

The Portland JACL Board is excited to inform you that our chapter was selected to participate in a new pilot fundraising program with the National JACL Credit Union. This program is designed to help our chapter with our annual fundraising efforts, help our current and new JACL members with their auto loans, and help the National JACL Credit Union continue to grow so they can continue to support the JACL activities in the future.

This program is very simple and it does not require us to sell anything to anyone. The National JACL Credit Union is offering our chapter 70 basis points on the funded loan amount of any auto loan that our members receive from them. The loan can be for a new auto loan or a refinance of a current auto loan that is not currently at the credit union. The contribution to our chapter is from the credit union so there are no added fees to your loan.

The following is an example of the income that our chapter can receive:
