Veterans Day is Extra-Special for the Japanese American Community by Setsy Sadamoto Larouche

As November arrives, many people start thinking of the Thanksgiving Day Holiday with Christmas season soon to arrive after that. This year I think it's important to not skip over an equally important holiday, namely **Veterans Day**.

Veterans Day use to be called Armistice Day, to celebrate the end of World War I, also nicknamed the war to end all wars. Having clearly not lived up to its nickname, with the advent of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day was officially changed to Veterans Day in 1954.

Our community is blessed to have been represented by some very heroic military people in those two subsequent wars. The Nisei Veterans of World War II were honored by being awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 2010. Amongst the many decorations these soldiers received, noteworthy were the 21 **Medals of Honor** and the 9486 **Purple Hearts**, the most of any unit of its size in WWII. Interestingly, their Congressional Gold Medal presentation was preceded by the Native American Code Talkers in 2008 and the Women Airforce Service Pilots of WWII in 2009. the Nisei Veterans were the Fallen Heroes of September 2001 and the Montford Point Marines awarded in 2011, The First Special Service Force of World War II in 2013, the American Fighter Aces, the Doolittle Tokyo Raiders and the World War II members of the Civil Air Patrol, the Monuments, Fine Arts and Archives Section of the Allied Armies, and the 65th Infantry Regiment, all in 2014. Congress finally caught up to awarding the Congressional Gold Medal to the Filipino Veterans of WWII in 2016 and the Chinese-American Veterans of WWII in 2018. Certainly, the Nisei Veterans are amongst some very notable awardees.

In June 2021, the Nisei Veterans of World War II were honored again with the issuance of the Go For Broke stamp by the US Postal Service. This was a long-fought project by the late **Aiko Ogata King** and the late **Fusa Takahashi** who worked 15 years to make this happen along with **Wayne Osako** whose help was essential to make the Go For Broke stamp a reality. The commemorative event in Portland was held at the Oregon Historical

1 Society on June 14, 2021.

Most recently, the Oregon Nisei Veterans of WWII were honored with having Highway 35, that connects Mount Hood to Government Camp, named in their honor. The ceremony to commemorate that event was held in Hood River/Odell on August 13, 2022, with the 426 known soldiers who participated in that War memorialized on a placard that will be displayed on the highway along with a special tribute to the 17 Nisei soldiers who lost their life during World War II.

Every year on Memorial Day, the community gathers at the Japanese Cemetery located inside the Rose City Cemetery to honor all the community veterans who paid the ultimate price not only during World War II but also those in the Korean War and Vietnam as well.

So hopefully on Veterans Day, you'll take a moment to remember the heroic effort of our Nisei Veterans and perhaps you'll join the community next year at Japanese Cemetery when we observe Memorial Day for all the deceased veterans.

🔹 Resilience — A Sansei Sense of Legacy 🦆

Special exhibit at the Japanese American Museum of Oregon October 2nd – December 22nd, 2022



Resilience — A Sansei Sense of Legacy is an exhibition of eight artists whose work reflects on the effect of Executive Order 9066 as it resonated from generation to generation. While several of the artists in Resilience employ traditional Japanese methods in the construction of their work - Lydia Nakashima Degarrod's use of boro stitching on her works on paper and Na Omi Judy Shintani's use of kintsuai on the ceramic vessels which accompany her deconstructed kimonos — others use iconography relating to Japanese culture as a jumping-off point for personal explorations on the subject of the incarceration camps — Reiko Fujii's photographs-as-kimono and Tom Nakashima's mixed media collage on Byôbu folding screen. Each in their own way, the artists in this exhibition express moments of deeply-felt pain and reluctant acceptanceemotions which were often withheld by their elders.

Exhibition artists are Kristine Aono, Reiko Fujii, Wendy Maruyama, Lydia Nakashima Degarrod, Tom Nakashima, Roger Shimomura, Na Omi Judy Shintani, and Jerry Takigawa. The exhibition was co-curated by artist Jerry Takigawa and Gail Enns.

This exhibition is a program of ExhibitsUSA, a national division of Mid-America Arts Alliance, and the National Endowment for the Arts.
